ABOUT THE CAMPOREE THEME

The 2010 Spring Camporee is all about the basics of Boy Scouting. In honor of the 100th anniversary of Scouting in American, the camporee will focus on the core skills and adventures that is symbolic of Scouting. The activities that have been laid out challenge the boys in basic pioneering skills and games, where participation is all that's required to have fun.

This activities are:

- 1) Pioneering Games
- 2) Bucking Barrel
- 3) Paul Bunyan Fire Starter
- 4) Rope Obstacle Course
- 5) Treasure Hunt
- 6) Silent Signals
- 7) Monkey Bridge
- 8) Fireman's Tower
- 9) Scout Trivia
- 10) Canoe Races
- 11) Handicapped Races
- 12) Log Sawing Contest
- 13) Tug-of-War

Scouting skills to practice are; Knot Tying, Lashing, Personal Fitness, Map & Compass, Fire Starting with Flint and Steel. All Scouts need to carry their Totin' Chip, and Firem'n Chit cards and be prepared to present them to the judges.

This year we are branching out in our efforts to bring new ideas for older scouts, we have set up several different types of campsites for use for Troops, or even Patrols. Several Campsites are located away from the main area and are accessible only by backpacking in. Furthermore, there are several sites that are located on islands and canoes must be used to access these sites. These sites are limited, and are assigned on a first come, first serve basis, so get your registration in as soon as possible to reserve them.

In addition to the theme events, as with all camporees, we encourage scouts to show pride in their troop and patrol. A "gateway" in keeping with the theme would be an excellent way to exhibit this pride, as well as defined patrol camp sites. Show off your troops scout craft by creating a camp gadget and demonstrating how it works. Nothing is too small—just be sure the knots and lashes are done correctly. Remember your troop flag and encourage official uniforms. These things will be considered in the camp site inspection. Additionally, inspections will occur this year while the scouts are in camp. We will be looking for scout spirit in the boys,

cleanliness in their activities and patrol camps and general patrol method. So dust off your patrol flag and carry them with you! Judges may even ask to hear patrol cheers or yells while they're in camp.

PLANNING AHEAD

- Scouts should brush up on the sections of the Boy Scout Handbook that pertain to the activities listed above.
- Hatchets will be used for fire building so bring your Totin' Chip and your Firem'n Chit, as you will need to show them to the judges.
- Each troop is asked to prepare a skit or song for the campfire, please make sure it is appropriate.

LOCATION: The Camporee will be located this year at Lake Sequoyah, just East of Fayetteville. A map link is on the Events page of www.razorbackscouts.org and included in this packet.

ARRIVAL: Plan to arrive at the Camporee between 4:00 pm and 8:00 pm on Friday, April 16th, 2010. Please unload vehicles and trailers as quickly as possible. All cars and trucks must be parked outside of the campsite area in the designated areas.

EVENT CHECK-IN PROCEDURES: Please follow these procedures to check-in:

1. Upon arrival your unit representative should report to the Headquarters tent to check-in.
2. Turn in your Troup Event Roster of youth and adults and pay any remaining fees.
3. Turn in a copy of your unit's Tour Permit. (Worth 10pts.)
4. Your unit's camp site will be provided to you along with a map showing where it is located. Please try to stay within your assigned camping area, a final ribbon for "Leave No Trace" will be awarded after the camporee is over.

PARKING: Parking is not allowed within the campsite areas. You may unhitch your trailer and park in the assigned area. Trailers are not allowed in Backpacking or canoe (naturally) accessible camp sites.

ORIENTATION & CRACKER BARREL FOR SCOUTMASTERS AND

SENIOR PATROL LEADERS: A leader Orientation and cracker barrel will be held at 9:30 pm on Friday evening in the Headquarters Tent. Units will receive information critical to your unit's enjoyment of the event at this time. Be sure to have a responsible adult leader(s) and your Senior Patrol Leader in attendance.

UNIFORMS: Troops should arrive and depart in full uniform (a scout always travels in uniform). We encourage every one to be in uniform Saturday during activities. Remember this is a "100 year" anniversary event, and we've asked the local media to come out and cover the event! We want to put our best foot forward, and wearing the uniform is a good first step. Uniforms are required to be worn for the Saturday evening campfire and Sunday assembly.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES - "A SCOUT IS REVERENT": There will be an interfaith worship service on Sunday morning at 8:30 am at the camp fire area. Please bring chairs if you like. All units are encouraged to participate. Units are also encouraged to conduct their own faith services if desired.

WATER: There will NOT be water available on site. Please plan to provide what you need for cooking, cleansing and drinking.

PORTA-POTTIES: The responsibility for Porta-potty cleaning and upkeep will be shared by the troops. A leaning schedule and instructions will be distributed at cracker barrel.

SAFETY: Safety is the responsibility of everyone at the camporee. Westark Area Council provides additional accident insurance for all participants. To be covered, all accidents must be immediately reported to the first-aid station located at the Headquarter Tent. This insurance does not cover sickness or injuries occurring

before the event or chronic conditions. Please have updated health histories and insurance information available on each of your Scouts. Any unsafe or improper use of knives, axes, or other tools will result in a lowering of the camp site inspection score.

FIRE: Open fires are allowed as long as they are contained within a raised burn barrel. Please review the "Guide to Safe Scouting" and be sure campsites are arranged with those standards in mind, paying close attention to those regulations regarding fires. Have fire buckets and fire fighting tools available. Do not cut live trees from the park! Leave no fire unattended. Make sure fires are completely out, and ashes are disposed of properly.

WASTE DISPOSAL: All campsite trash should be bagged and removed from the site by each troop. There will be NO waste disposal on site.

QUIET HOURS: Lights out will be at 11:00 pm. Reveille will be at 7:00 am. Quiet hours are between those times. Up to 100 points may be deducted from the campsite inspection score for failure to observe this rule.

ALCOHOL AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES: The Boy Scouts of America prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by the Boy Scouts of America, or at any activity involving participation of youth members.

TOBACCO USE: Adult leaders should support the attitude that young adults are better off without tobacco and should not allow the use of tobacco products at any BSA activity involving youth participants.

DO NOT BRING: Electronic Games, fireworks, radios/CD players/Ipods/MP3 players.

LOST AND FOUND: Camporee Lost and Found will be located at Camporee Headquarters.

CHECK OUT AND DEPARTURE: When your troop campsite is ready to depart, locate a staff member at the Headquarters Tent to conduct a check out inspection. If upon inspection the unit campsite is adequately cleaned up, event patches will be delivered and the unit will be free to go. Check out will begin at 9:30, Please give our staff the courtesy of attending services and having breakfast before approaching them for check out before 9:30.

Please discuss the following page of camp rules (as well as those contained with in these pages) with your unit prior to arrival at camp and then post in camp (10pts).

CAMPORIEE RULES

Please Post in Camp

1. No vehicles in the camp areas (except for troop trailers).
2. Quiet time is from 11:00 pm to 7:00 am.
3. No Electronic Games, fireworks, radios/CD players/Ipods/MP3 players.
4. No guns, sheath knives, or scabbard knives
5. No alcohol or illegal drugs
6. No SMOKING IN CAMPS
7. Keep Porta-potties clean - Do NOT put trash in toilets. Each Troop will have cleaning responsibilities. See Schedule.
8. ALWAYS leave your campsite cleaner than you found it.
9. Never walk through another Unit's campsite. Always ask permission before entering another Unit's area.

FIRE SAFETY RULES

1. Be very careful with fires, have fire buckets and fire fighting tools available. Leave no fire unattended.
2. Do not cut trees or break limbs from the trees on the private property we have been allowed to use.
3. Make sure fires are cold, and the ashes are disposed of properly before leaving the area.
